*Amos 3:8 The lion hath roared, who will not fear?
the Lord GOD hath spoken, who can but prophesy?*

If we were in an area where lions roam freely, we certainly would fear if we heard one roar. We would fear because we know the fierceness of the lion and that we are helpless against his power. The roar of the lion would serve as warning to take heed and get to protection.

The lion in Amos 3:8 probably has a double meaning, referring to a physical lion as well as the LORD. The people of that area would have been well familiar with lions freely roaming and the dangers. Amos is warning them of the dangers of the LORD roaring.

In Amos 1:2 we are told, “*The LORD will roar from Zion.*” When the LORD speaks, who can do anything but prophesy as Amos says. For us today, that would be preaching and telling others about the word of God.

Not only are they unaware of the horrible fate of being lost, but they are also unaware of the wondrous glory in Heaven that will

forever be. We need to speak and proclaim to give as many as we possibly can the opportunity to hear the gospel, which is truly good news.

The LORD has roared in Zion. Let us fear and obey and warn others that the LORD has roared with his mighty voice. Joel 3:16, “*The LORD also shall roar out of Zion, and utter his voice from Jerusalem; and the heavens and the earth shall shake: but the LORD will be the hope of his people, and the strength of the children of Israel.*”

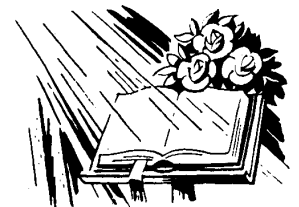
