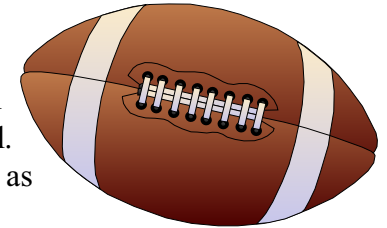
ever get sick? The difference is in their attitude and determination. They get sick, but they press on when the illness is minor or they simply don't feel good. Other things happen, but the worship services come first.

## The Wrong Way

A few years ago a plane crashed in Lexington, Kentucky as it attempted to take off, killing 49 of 50 people. The plane had attempted to take off on the wrong runway. This particular runway was too short for a commercial jet to be able to obtain the necessary speed for a successful take off.

The correct runway was near the wrong one and had similar numbers, and no doubt, they both were very similar in most ways, yet the differences caused destruction and great loss of life.

Consider how many people are following the Lord in this manner. They feel they are following correctly. The manner in which they are worshiping seems similar to what the Bible authorizes and teaches, but it is different. The differences will lead to spiritual death and everlasting destruction.

There was a way that seemed right to the pilot, but it lead to destruction. Proverbs 14:12 and 16:25 have nearly identical wording, *“There is a way which seemeth right unto a man, but the end thereof [are] the ways of death.”*

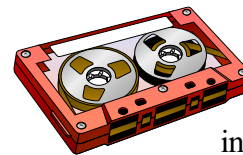

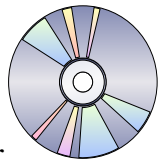
## Bible Quiz
