Isaiah 43:19, “Behold, I will do a new thing; now it shall spring forth; shall ye not know it? I will even make a way in the wilderness, [and] rivers in the desert.”

This is the first LORD’s day of Spring. There is much in the Bible about things “springing up.” In the above verse in Isaiah, the LORD said He would make a new thing and it would “spring forth.”

I feel this is a reference to Christ and the church that was yet to come when this verse was written. It would spring forth and make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert.

The Bible often refers to the LORD’s “way.” The church would be the way in the wilderness. No doubt this wilderness is a metaphor for the world and sin. It’s hard to walk through a wilderness that is grown up with thorns and briars. It’s much easier if a pathway has already been cleared.

The LORD established the church for us as the way we are to travel in this life. There are many “thorns and briars” of sin that can easily

snare us in this life, but a way has sprung forth for us to travel. It is the path the LORD has laid out for us.

A desert is called such because of the lack of water. Those in the area where Isaiah was would have been very familiar with the scarcity of water. They had to dig for wells and even then water was rare.

This new thing the LORD was going to do was not just to put water in the desert, but make a river in the desert. The way of the LORD is to us as a river of water in the desert. A river was even more beneficial than a pool because of the continual flow that brought fresh water. This water was never stagnate, but fresh and life-bringing.

Those in the world are dying of thirst and are not even aware. They are dying of spiritual thirst. There is a river flowing that those in the LORD can easily partake of. This is part of the new thing the LORD said He would make. This is salvation and being in the church—the body of Christ.

Isaiah later wrote in Isaiah 55:1, “Ho, every one that thirsteth, come ye to the waters, and he that hath no money; come ye, buy, and eat; yea, come, buy wine and milk without money and without price.” This is obviously talking about being satisfied spiritually. You can come and partake of this water and food without money. It freely flows for all of us in the LORD.

There is certainly a wilderness and desert all about us. Most are hopelessly lost and dying of thirst in this wilderness and desert. The LORD has made a new way that has sprung up. This provides a path and quenches thirst. Don’t let yourself be lost in this wilderness and desert. Find your way and quench your thirst in the LORD.

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Mark 4:26-27, “<sup>26</sup>And he said, *So is the kingdom of God, as if a man should cast seed into the ground; <sup>27</sup>And should sleep, and rise night and day, and the seed should spring and grow up, he knoweth not how.*”
