Jeremiah 9:2, “*Oh that I had in the wilderness a lodging place of wayfaring men; that I might leave my people, and go from them! for they [be] all adulterers, an assembly of treacherous men.*”

Sin almost seems to be smothering us. Sometimes one just feels like getting away from all this sin. Jeremiah felt the same. In the above verse he desired a lodging place for wayfaring men. He wanted to get away from where he was. He says he wants to “*leave my people and go from them!*”

Why would Jeremiah want to do this? The next phrase tells us. He says, “*For they be all adulterers, an assembly of treacherous men.*” Jeremiah was surrounded by sin and just wanted to leave.

I’m sure we all have felt that way at times. We all have just wanted to get away for one reason or another. There is no better reason for wanting to get away than sin surrounding us. That doesn’t mean we ourselves are sinless. There is a difference from the periodic sins of people in the LORD versus those who are living sinful lives all the time and care not that they are.
